The clubhouse has gone through more improvements over the

winter with a fresh coat of paint. We are planning to expand the kitchen and replace the cupboards in the fall. The floating dock project was a success last year and we are planning to continue with 4 new docks this year. There will be 2 new 30' and 2 new 34' floating docks built by club volunteers. Thank you to Jamie Nicol for taking the lead on this project. We will be beginning construction of the new washrooms in the south basin. It looks like using scaffolding for the mast storage seemed to be a good

solution. I would like to thank all the members for pitching in with the projects that arise. The quick response to address issues and assist is great to see. If you can offer some time for the projects, please let us know.

The porta-potties will be available in the South until the new washrooms are complete.



FUEL: Cheque or E-transfer, with your own mobile device. You must send a **separate Email** with your security

ANSWER whenever making an Etransfer.

Please note that Payments for fuel should not be combined with any other payments.

The Tradition of Sailpast

The Sailpast tradition began at the first Yacht Club that was formed at Cowes in England nearly 200 years ago. The membership at Cowes was primarily aristocratic and many were familiar with naval practice and tradition. Cowes Yacht Club subsequently changed its name to the Royal Yacht Squadron and certain social graces were added to the traditional naval practices.

The actual "review of the fleet" is steeped in more than 600 years of Royal Navy tradition and history and was introduced in Yacht clubs as a continuation of the naval habit of having Admirals (and/or Royalty) review the fleet on special occasions.



Protocol demanded that a flagship be anchored with the Admiral and staff on the quarterdeck to receive and return the salute. Vessels sailed past, dipping their colours in salute, and with their captain also saluting with the ship's company standing at attention. The Vice Admiral would lead the fleet passing in review and the final vessel in the line would carry the Rear Admiral.

Our Yacht Club tradition is almost identical, except that the salute is received by the Commodore instead of the Admiral and the salute is delivered by the passing boat, if under sail, by luffing its jib, or, if under power, by dipping its ensign. All of the crew on the saluting boat stands at attention facing the Commodore, who is the only one to salute by hand. If there is insufficient wind, sailboats should have their engines on.

Protocol dictates that until the Sailpast is completed, only the flagship may be dressed (strung with bunting and flags). However, after the Sailpast, participating yachts are encouraged to dress on returning to their dock.

By precedent, Sailpast is a formal event that officially opens the boating season. The Navy and many yacht clubs also follow the Sailpast with a "Blessing of the Fleet", a long standing European tradition, first practiced in Portugal, of seeking divine providence to those who labored or ventured on the sea to assure good harvest, safe passage and safe return. At IYC the Sailpast is accompanied by dressing the clubhouse and flagpole and a formal raising of the national flag, accompanied by a cannon salute. The ceremony is followed by a reception on the lawn.

Like most boating activities, Sailpast is somewhat weather dependent. We all hope for a bright sunny day, calm seas and just enough wind to propel the boats around the course in an orderly fashion. But Mother Nature does not always cooperate. In that case a sailor's ingenuity comes into play.

Tradition dictates that all club members participate in the Sailpast, on their own or on another member's yacht. Good manners require that a member unable to participate will send his/her regrets to the Commodore.





Mooring Report

Well we are full again! There may have to be a little movement of moorings once everyone is in after we see how the boats are fitting.

We had a mooring meeting March 23rd with a good turn out. There were several changes made with moorings coming from Full Member requests and also moving one member from a temporary mooring to a permanent. We will once again have 2 new members that will have to be bounced around until more slips become available.

I would once again like to remind members that the measurements of their boats are overall beam and length including pulpits and swim platforms. If you plan on having a dingy on your platform that must be included also. It makes a big difference when a 35 ft boat takes up a 40ft space when trying to assign a mooring.


It has been a very rewarding job (most times) being on the board for the past 8 years and I would like to thank all of the members on the Mooring Committee for your help.

Fuel Dock & Safety

Well the 2019 season is fast approaching and soon we will be once again back on the water.

I'd like to start by thanking all the members for their support of the fuel dock in 2018 and hope for the same support for 2019.

We had a great season on the fuel dock pumping some 40,000 Litres of Fuel (Gas and Diesel) this as far as I know is the best season on record.

2018 season saw us using our new pump out

equipment for the first time and as a user myself I think we made a good choice. It worked flawlessly.

I'd also like to recognize Kurtis Lowe for his good work on the dock and am pleased to report he'll be back for the 2019 season. Thank you Kurtis.

On the Safety of our Members, their boats, and the Club I'd like to report that everything was fine, but such was not the case. We did experience three issues that necessitated removal of the boats from our basin. Fortunately these

instances did not cause and major environmental issues but were taken as a wakeup call by our board. You may notice that the board is going to be more diligent on enforcing the club rules as they apply to safety issues and I'm sure that the Members will understand the need for this.

We updated our "Spill Containment Kit" in 2018 and you will see it located at the fuel dock during the season and is available to all members on a 24/7 emergency bases. It's a large yellow plastic drum and it has the required booms and equipment to surround a oil or fuel spill.

We also purchased a gas operated water pump (presently located in our garage) available to dewater boats in distress. This along with our smaller electric sump pump (located in storage room of clubhouse) is available to all members in case of emergency.

Safety is all of our jobs lets keep our Club, Members, Guests and our boats Safe.

CRANE STARTING LOCATIONS:

Big Crane (#1)

1) * Start in **FRONT OF THE CLUBHOUSE** and work **TO THE MAST HOIST**.



- 2) * To the **NEW GAS DOCK** & work toward the gas & pump-out station.
- * Launch all boats at the **WEST END OF THE SOUTH BASIN...** proceeding **DOWN THE OLD GAS DOCK.**

SMALL CRANE (#2)

1) * Start INSIDE THE GATE AT THE WEST BASIN around TO THE CLUBHOUSE.

PLEASE REMEMBER!

- * Be familiar with the Launch & Haul Out Guidelines.
- * Most boats will be required to move immediately following launch to allow space for the launching of other boats.
- * Please do not dock in an area where boats have yet to be launched.

KEEP IT SAFE!!

- * Make safety a priority when working close to the crane. If you are not involved, make sure and your guests stay well clear of the lifting area.
- * The best place to park is on the road or upper parking lot. Please do not park in areas that can impede the movement of the crane.
- * Your patience and tolerance for those "unplanned things" is appreciated...if you do anticipate any problems please let the Launch & Haul Out Committee know as soon as possible.

CRADLE MOVING - SUNDAY MAY 05, 2019 @ 0900 HRS.

- * If you have a cradle please be here on Sunday. Have your cradle clearly identified with your last name & first initial. Please have your cradle tied up so nothing will swing and no ladders attached to cradles.
- * We are always looking for 4X4's and rigging to assist in cradle moving.
- * Ensure your cradle is tied down and will not unfold.


